Metro is asking for a new tax levy this November (Measure 26-178 on your ballot) despite the fact that it already has sufficient funds to operate all its parks. In 2002, the Metro Council enacted a garbage tax for the specific purpose of funding operations and maintenance of Metro parks. That amount was raised to \$2.50 per ton in 2004. Between 2002 and 2015, the garbage tax brought in \$46.8 million for Metro parks. Given that Metro raised all this money for parks, why is Metro asking for voter approval of another \$80 million parks levy in the upcoming November election? Where did the \$46.8 million in garbage tax money go?

The answer can be found in bait & switch ordinance adopted by Metro in 2006. The Council amended the Metro Code to retain the garbage tax, but "undedicated" its use so that revenues would be to the Metro General Fund.


