Tax Notice for those residing in the Portland Community College District. You should have already received a ballot to approve or reject the PCC \$185 million dollar bond request. One determining factor to consider before mailing your ballot, their board of directors have designated the college as a "Sanctuary City" for illegal immigrants which violates federal law: 8 U.S. Code 1324. Looking ahead, mark the 2018 calendar for January 23! Voting day to repeal the \$550 million tax passed by the Oregon legislature on healthcare insurers and others.



Representative Mark Johnson R-52 has accepted the Presidency and CEO position of Oregon Business Industry which was created July 1, 2017 by the merger of Associated Oregon **Industries and Oregon Business** Association. With November as his stated resignation date, the process of selecting his replacement will begin once Representative Johnson notifies the Secretary of State's office. The Oregon Republican Party in conjunction with the County parties of Clackamas, Multnomah and Hood River will host a PCP convention to nominate 3-5 nominees to be appointed to the seat. After that meeting is completed the Secretary of State will notify the County Commissioners of the nominees. The nominees will be interviewed and voted upon by the elected Commissioners of Representative Johnson's district, Multnomah, Clackamas and Hood River Counties.

Fate of Oregon tolling scheme lies with U.S. Senate

"Right now, my amendment to prohibit Oregon from imposing unfair tolls on the I-5 and I-205 bridges lies in the fate of the U.S. Senate. I formally pressed Senator Patty Murray and Senator Maria Cantwell to fight for this amendment in the Senate's funding bill; we need their help to put Oregon's scheme on hold until Washington residents have assurance that the plan will not unfairly target their wallets.

Three out of 20 Southwest Washington representatives on Oregon's tolling advisory committee is nice, but not enough to ensure Washington commuters' interests and hard-earned dollars are protected. And while our region recognizes the need to improve I-5, the tolling plan won't do that. Oregon has stated its intentions - these tolls will either be used to price people out of their cars, or to pay for Oregon infrastructure miles away from the place of collection."




