Many questions were answered and doubts erased when Emily Smith representing Kevin Chambers on Measure 104, explained the Constitutional Amendment to insure the 3/5 majority rule remains preventing additional taxes and fees on to us, the taxpayers. Miranda Bonifield from Cascade Policy, elaborated on the many pitfalls of the Metro 6 ½ Million Bond Measure or as John Charles stated, the \$1 Billion measure for homeless housing Remember there is no cap on the original amount and we, as taxpayers, will foot the bill adding \$2-400 to our property taxes for 30 years! Much information was shared and explored on the grocery tax, Measure 103 and our hard fought Measure 105 to Abolish Sanctuary Status in Oregon to protect everyone.

Please Remember to vote and get your ballot turned into your County Elections office before 8pm on Tuesday November 6<sup>th</sup>.


