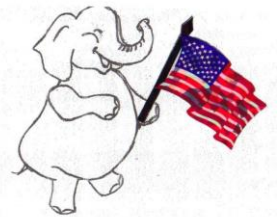

Oregon Republican Party Reorganizational Meeting Recap

Over 200 delegates and alternate delegates met in Keizer on February 16th to elect new party officers and hear reports from elected officials. State Representative Bill Post and State Senator Kim Thatcher welcomed the group to Marion County. There was a standing ovation for outgoing Vice-Chair Chris Barreto for all she has done for the Party of over the past few years.

After the speeches and the counting of the ballots Chair Bill Currier was reelected by a wide margin and Tracy Honl of Washington County was elected as the new Vice-Chair. Secretary Becky Mitts and Treasurer John Lee were elected by acclamation after the other candidates withdrew their names.

Former Party Chair Vance Day gave an incredible powerful speech discussing his long legal drama with the State of Oregon. He gave attendees great advice in never giving up and always fight for what is right even if you are standing alone. Our own Associate Member Kevin Moss gave a presentation on his trip to Taiwan and presented a resolution for the State Party to adopt which they overwhelmingly did. The resolution also instructs the ORP's RNC Members to introduce a similar resolution at the RNC Summer meeting.

Oregon is saddened again this month by the loss of another very good Republican, former Secretary of State and two term State School Superintendent, Norma Paulus. She was a leader for women in Oregon and was the first to start auditing all the state agencies. We must continue to follow her example. She will always be revered and missed greatly.

The Boring, Oregon Foundation, in partnership with Clackamas County Parks and the Park Committee of the Boring-Damascus Grange, is conducting a fundraising campaign to purchase and erect a second flagpole in Boring Station Trailhead Park. \$2670 has been raised to date toward the \$7500. goal.
