

Reports have been received from the National and State Republican Women's Conventions recently held in September and October. Both organizations voted to increase the yearly dues for all members. Mt. Hood Republican Women, along with all other Oregon clubs, have always paid \$16. as combined dues to both National and State organizations. The difference in club membership fees and the required State and National dues have always been retained by the local clubs. The new fees voted in are now, \$20. and \$10. For a total State and National fee of \$30. This equals our total club membership fee to be paid by our members for 2020. None of our membership monies collected would be retained by our Mt. Hood Club. I must add, our club is not alone in its' concern and will mail a letter to the new State President regarding our situation. With many of our members on fixed incomes, this is a hardship and will result in a loss of members. As President, I do not think it is the right decision to make to raise our club dues again or twice in one year. We will maintain our just enacted 2020 Membership dues of \$30. to remain the same. If we are prudent, we will be able to stay within the constraints of our soon to be passed 2020 budget. This will be a topic to be discussed at our next Mt. Hood


